Samsung Exits CRT Monitor Business

With Indian computer industry witnessing a switch to LCD or TFT (thin-film transistor) terminals from the conventional CRT (cathode ray tube) monitors, Samsung India has phased out CRT monitors from India.

The process began during the fourth quarter the last calendar year, and is now over. Now, the company has

started to roll out new models in the LCD monitor series T Monitor, Lime, and Myst Plus.

Talking to ChannelTimes, Gurpreet Brar, GM-IT Volume Sales, Samsung India, said, "Now, we are not shipping CRT monitors anywhere in India, and are replacing them with LCD monitors."

During early 2008, the sales of CRT monitors were low in the already dying CRT market. "We were loosing money, and had to bare with the high inventory • Strontium on Channel(8) costs," said Brar.

In fact, Samsung had a 34 percent market share in the CRT segment which saw 17-inch monitors contributing two thirds to the overall sales; while 15-inch *Lenovo's New Member(3) contributed the rest.

"Now we are totally focused on the LCD segment, and will ensure that the MORE POPULAR NEWS segment grows to 80 percent this year," added Brar.

According to IDC data, the total monitor market in India for FY 08 stands at Rs * Adobe's New Focus 4,529 crore of which LCD accounts for 74.2 percent, while the CRT stands at • SES, RT Together 25.8 percent.

LCD segment in India touched Rs 3,360 crore in FY 08, up from Rs 2,045 crore • Punjab CPs in Trouble during the previous fiscal, recording a 68 percent jump. On the other side, CRT segment saw a decline from 1,898 crore in FY 07 to Rs 1,170 crore in FY 08, a ▶SECTION NEWS drop of 38 percent.

Asked if Samsung has any plans to buy back the CRT monitors, Brar said we have no such offer now.
